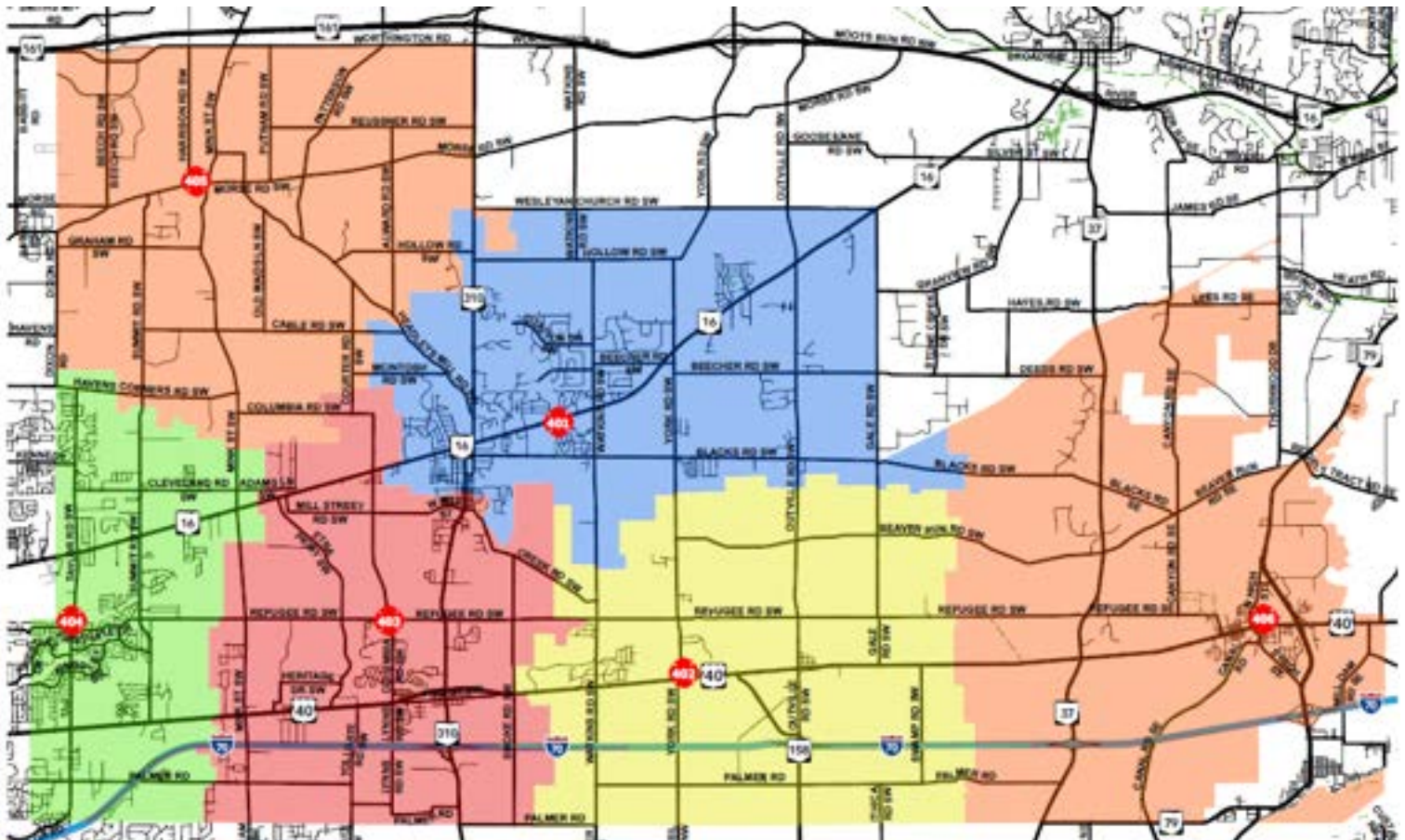
DISTRICT OVERVIEW



WHAT THE DISTRICT LOOKS LIKE NOW

West Licking fire district encompasses around 125 square miles servicing all or portions of three cities, two villages, and four townships. The area is served by six (6) fire stations that are found throughout the district to provide fire and ALS EMS service. The district employs 125 personnel, with one (1) fire chief, two (2) assistant chiefs, one (1) EMS coordinator, one (1) fiscal officer, three (3) mechanics, one (1) administrative professional, 91 career firefighters, four (4) fire marshals, and 22 part-time firefighters. All six (6) stations are staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

During the 2024 calendar year, the district managed 8,988 emergency responses. The average time from dispatch to responding to the emergency was 67 seconds. That accounts for all hours of the day, during training sessions, workouts, sleep, personal time or during meals.

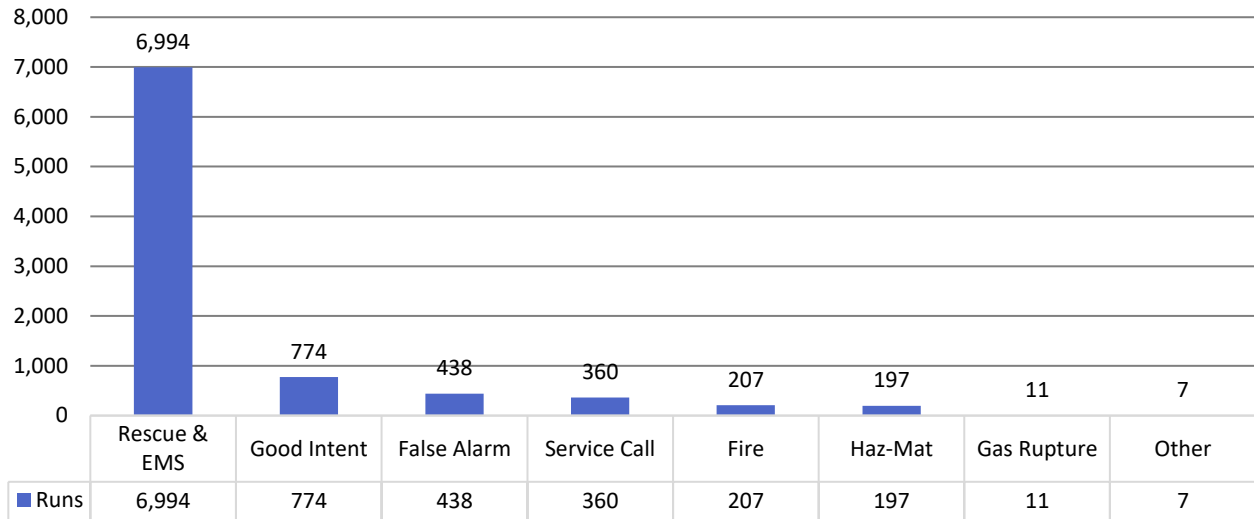

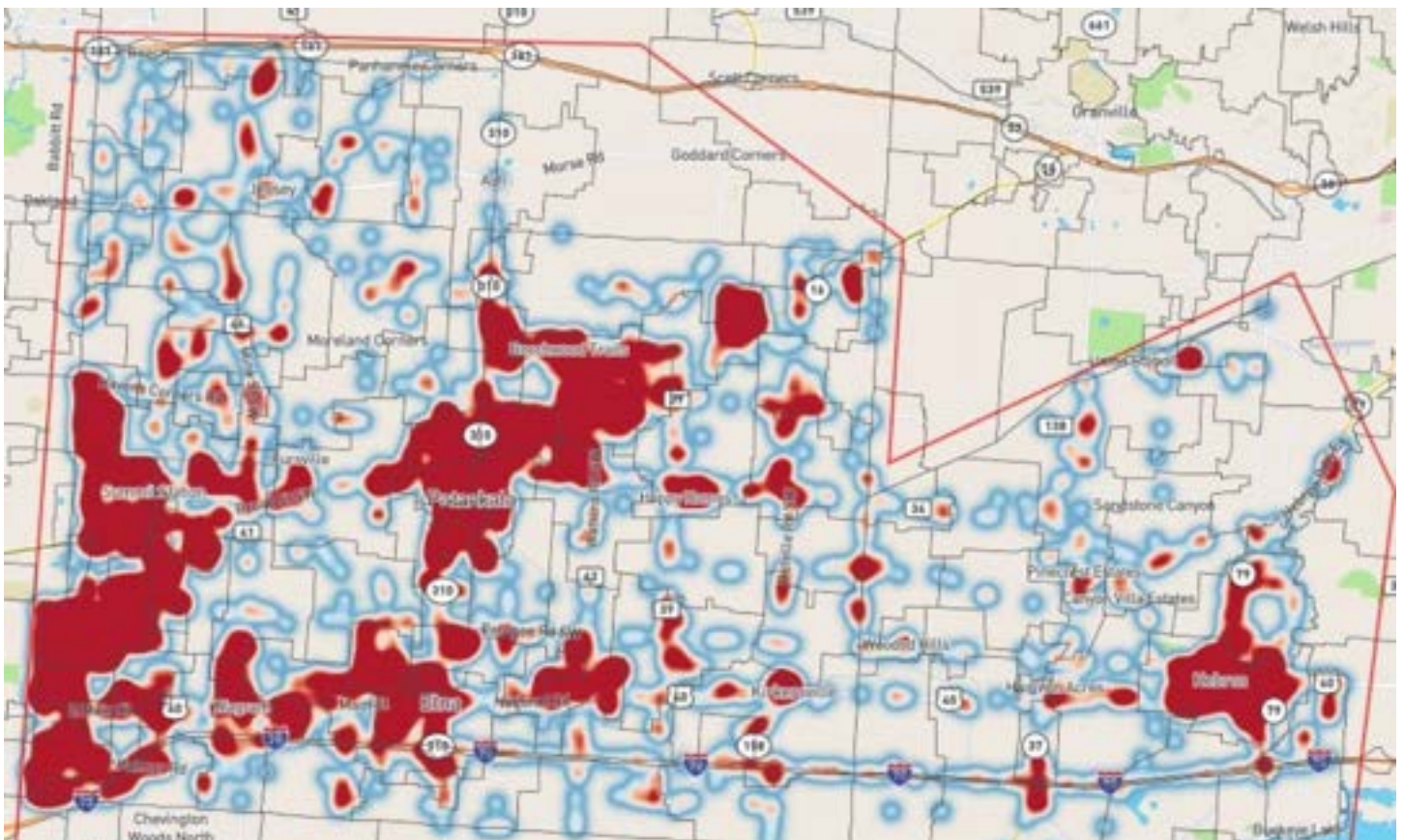

2024 INCIDENT TOTAL = 8,988

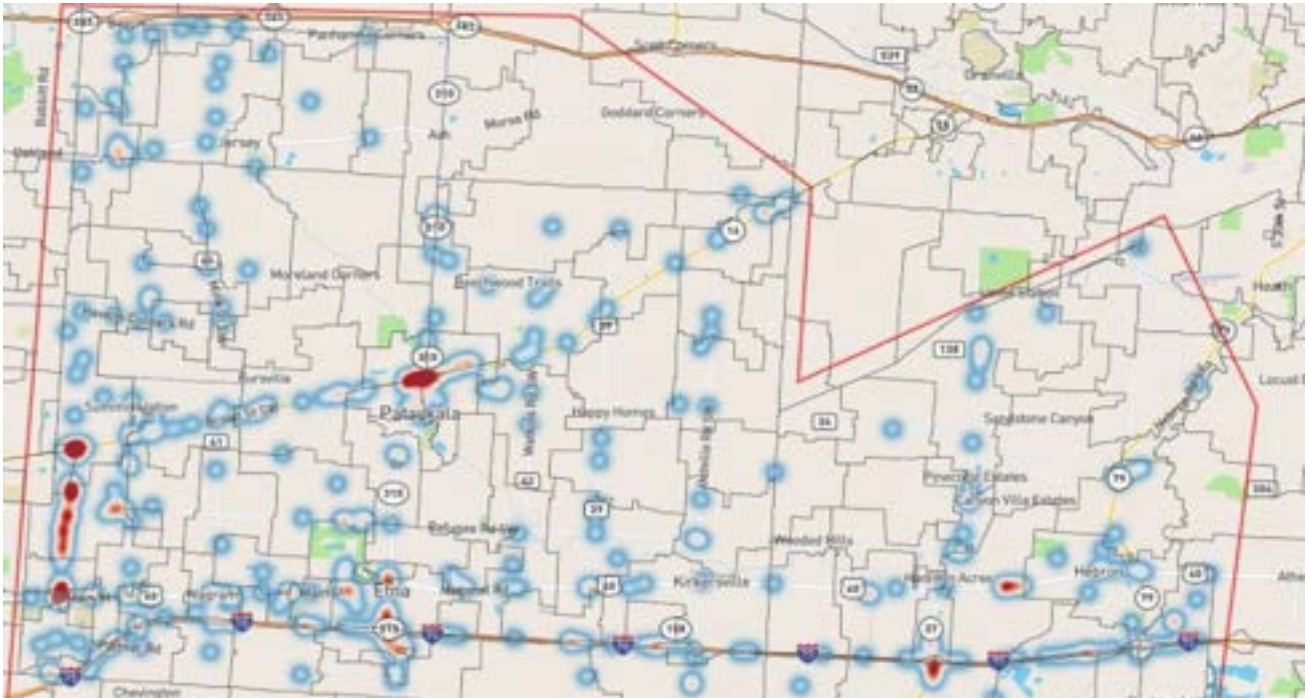


HEAT MAP FOR ALL RUNS IN THE DISTRICT FOR 2024

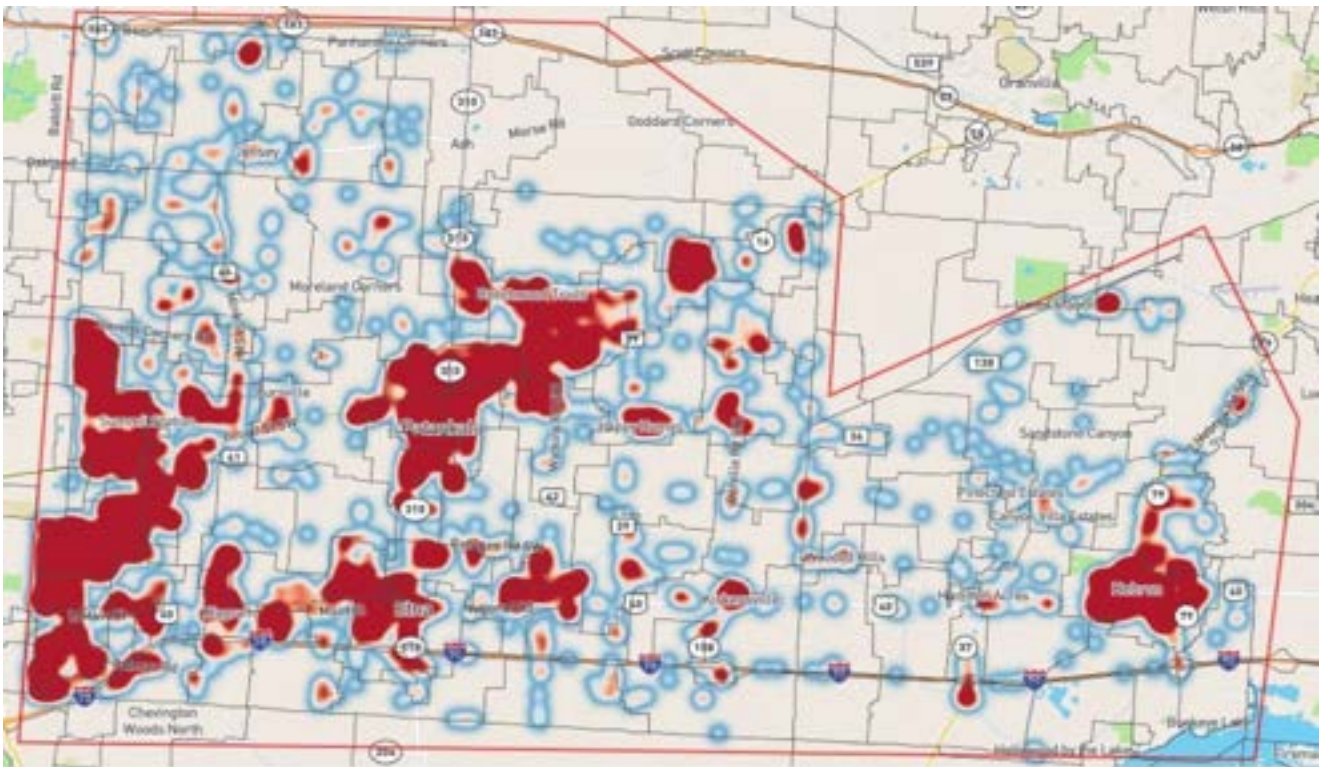


DISTRICT HEAT MAPS

HEAT MAP FOR MVA'S



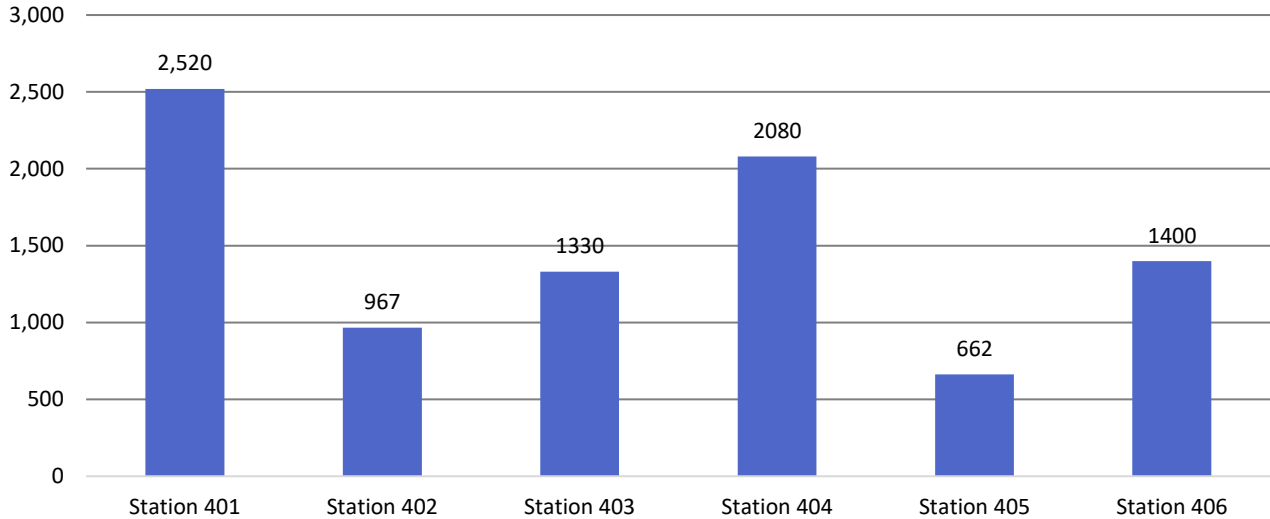
HEAT MAP FOR EMS CALLS EXCLUDING MVA'S

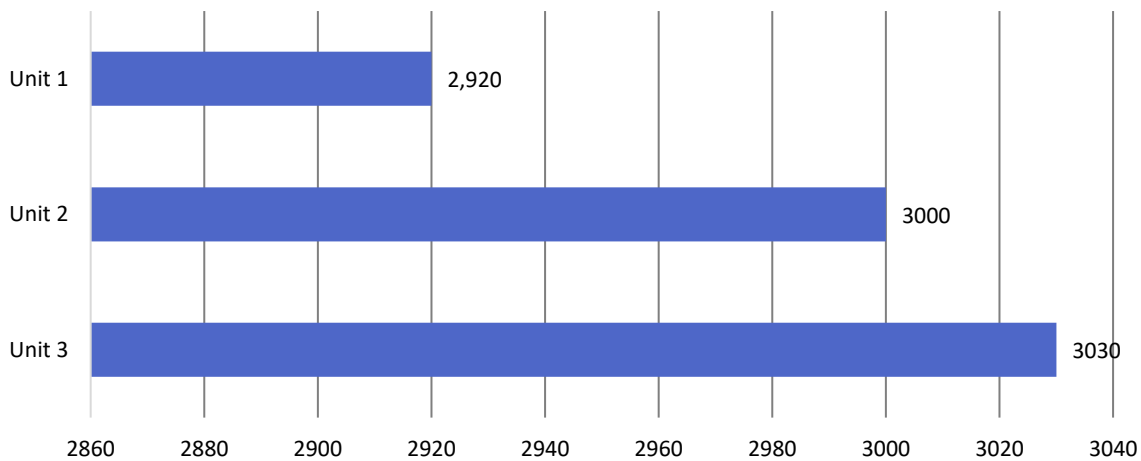

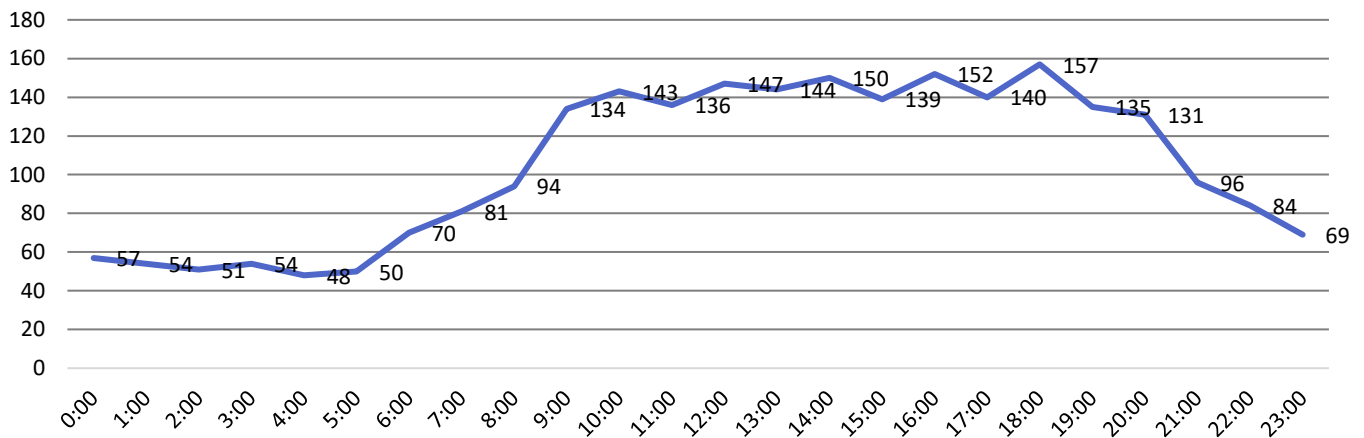
WELCOME TO STATION 401



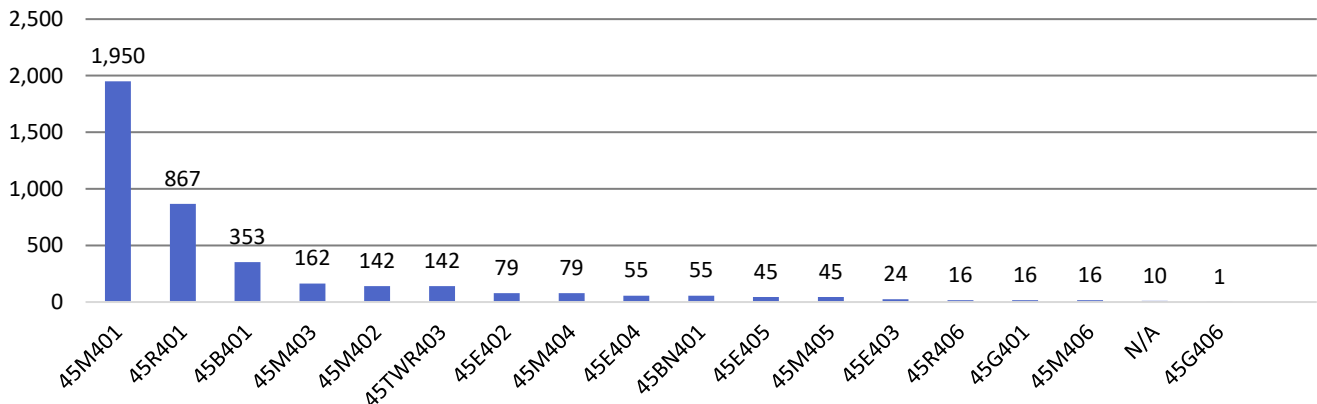
Station 401 currently houses one (1) Battalion Chief, one (1) officer, and four (4) firefighter/paramedics. The station is equipped with one (1) advanced life support (ALS) medic, one (1) rescue, one Battalion Chief’s vehicle, and one (1) grass truck.

The Administration Offices are found in the lower level of Station 401 and is staffed 8 a.m. through 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.

WELCOME TO STATION 402

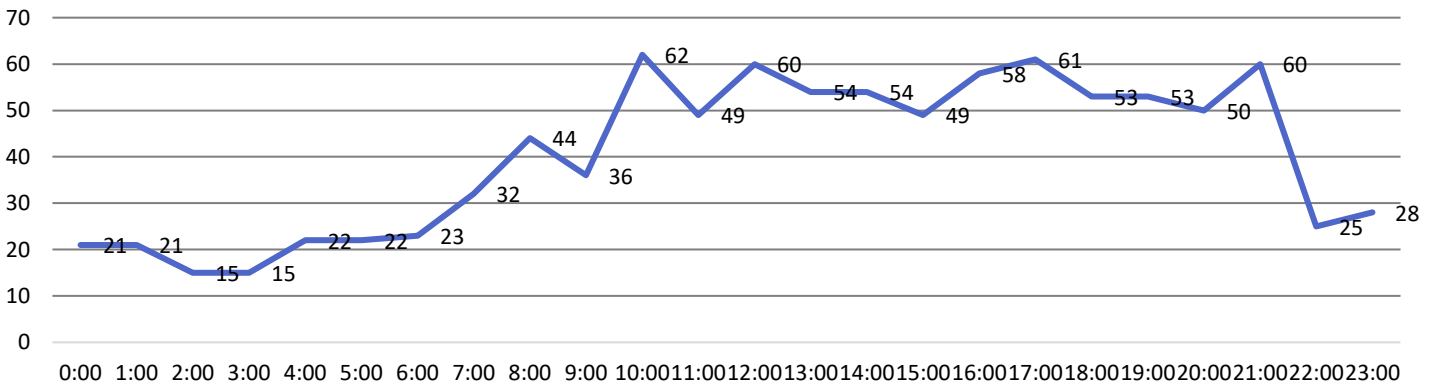


Station 402 was originally located at 120 North Fourth Street in Kirkersville. The station was closed in February 2018.

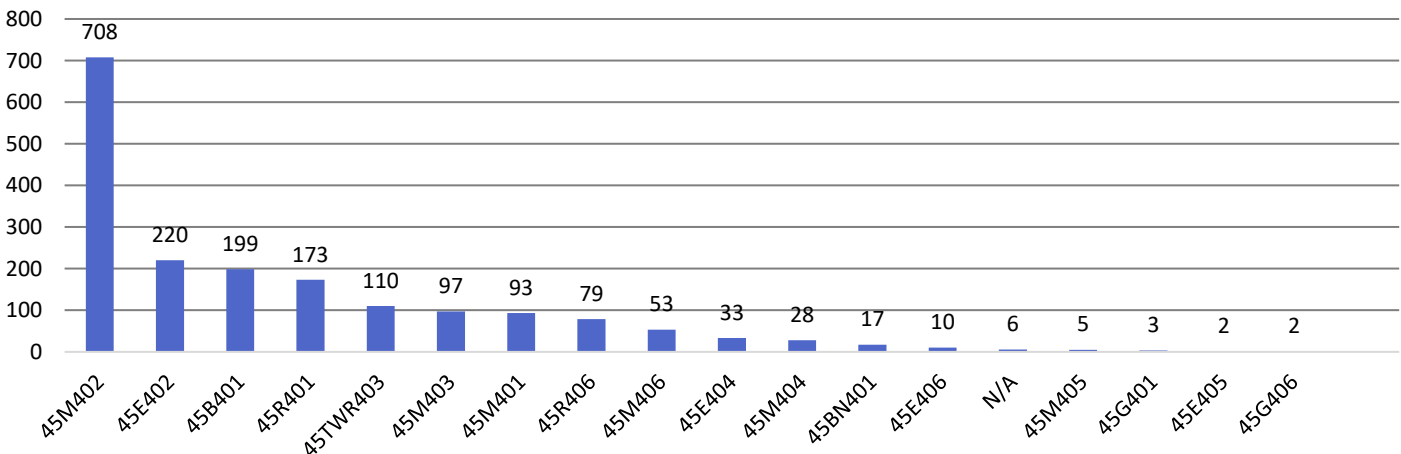
Today, you will find Station 402 at 7072 National Road, Etna. Along with the firehouse, this site houses mechanics and different training facilities. The responding crew at Station 402 consists of one (1) officer, and two (2) firefighter/paramedics that cross staff one (1) advanced life support (ALS) medic, and one (1) engine.

Along with the firehouse, the training campus has a house used for search and rescue situations, a concrete pad to simulate extrication scenarios, a burn building to train with live fire and a pond that we use for water and ice training.

Station 402 Area - Runs By Apparatus



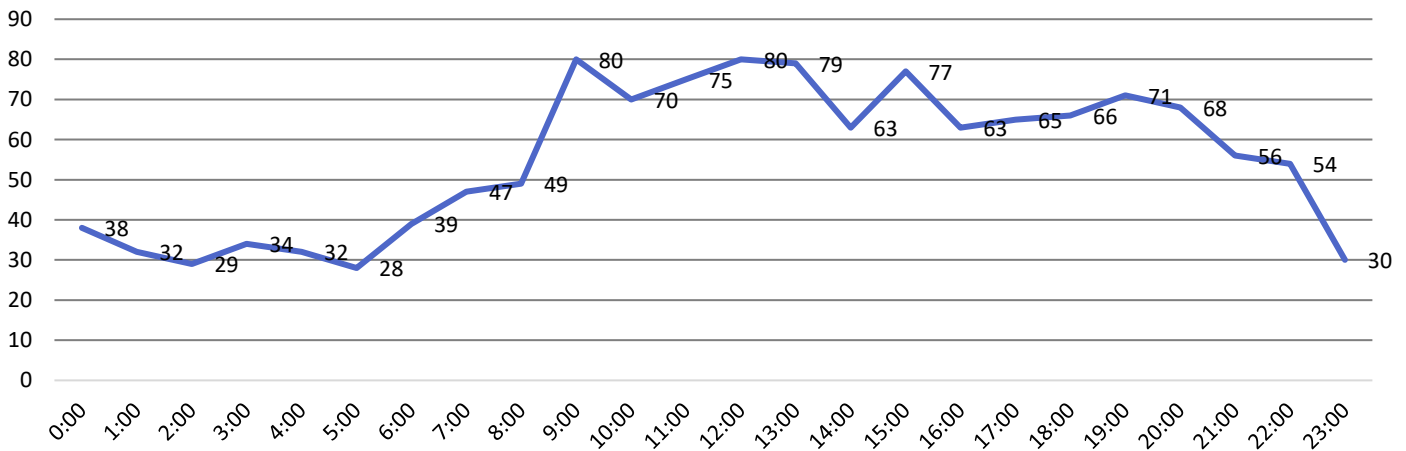
WELCOME TO STATION 403



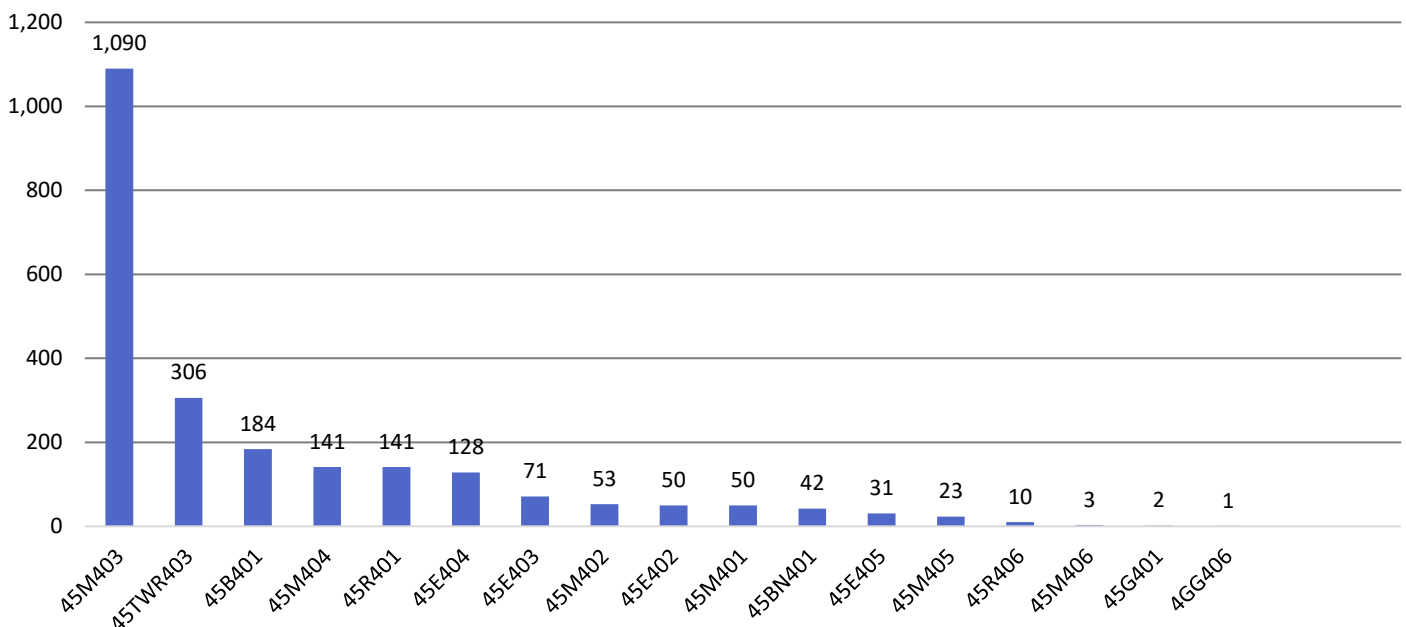
Station 403 has a new location as well. It moved from 7125 Mink Street, Pataskala to 8270 Columbia Road, Etna at the end of November of 2024.

Station 403 houses one (1) officer and two (2) firefighter/paramedics that cross staffs one (1) advanced life support (ALS) medic and one (1) tower.

Station 403 Area - Runs By Apparatus



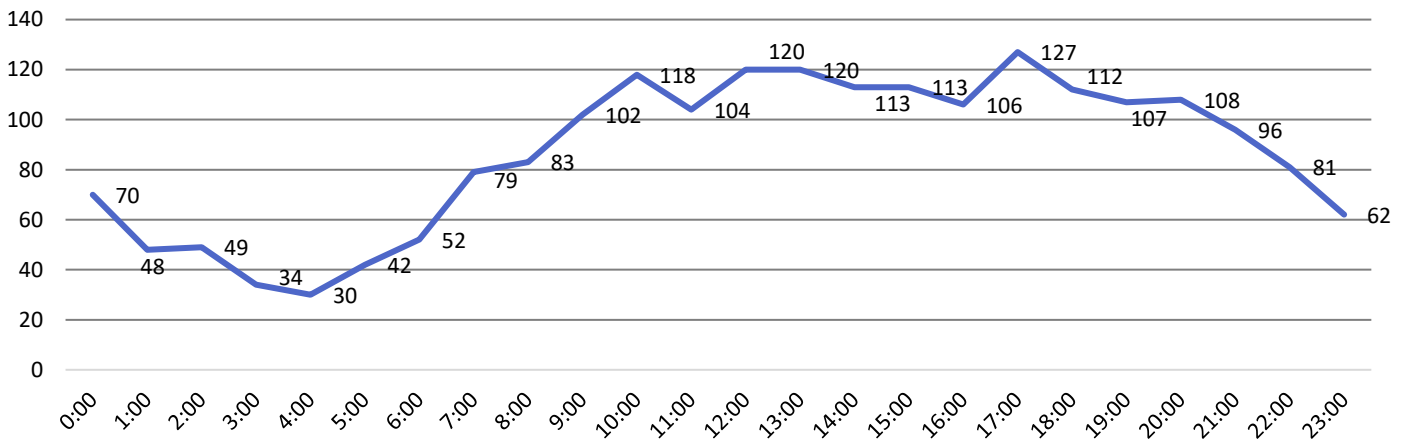
WELCOME TO STATION 404



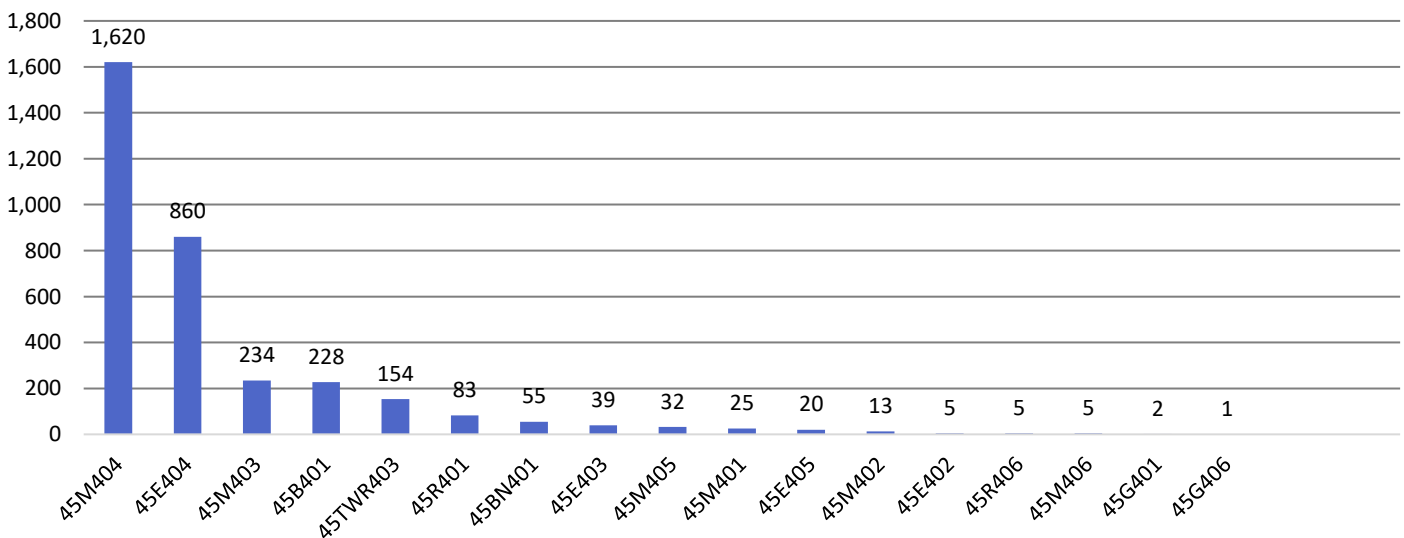
The addition of Station 404 was opened in July 2016 and was located at 7821 Taylor Road, Suite B in Reynoldsburg. It was staffed with one (1) officer and two (2) firefighter/paramedics. Station 404 was equipped with one (1) advanced life support (ALS) medic and one (1) first responder vehicle.

Station 404 moved south on Taylor Road to 8070 Taylor Road, Reynoldsburg in December of 2023. Station 404 houses (1) officer and four (4) firefighter/paramedics and is equipped with one (1) advanced life support (ALS) medic, one (1) UTV, and one (1) fire engine.

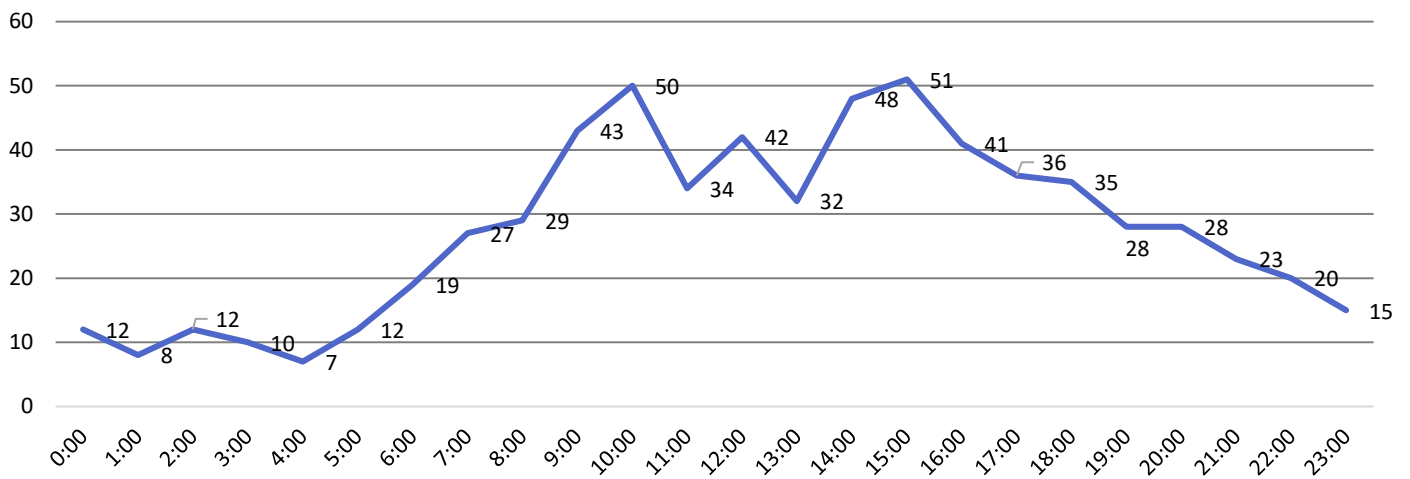


WELCOME TO STATION 405

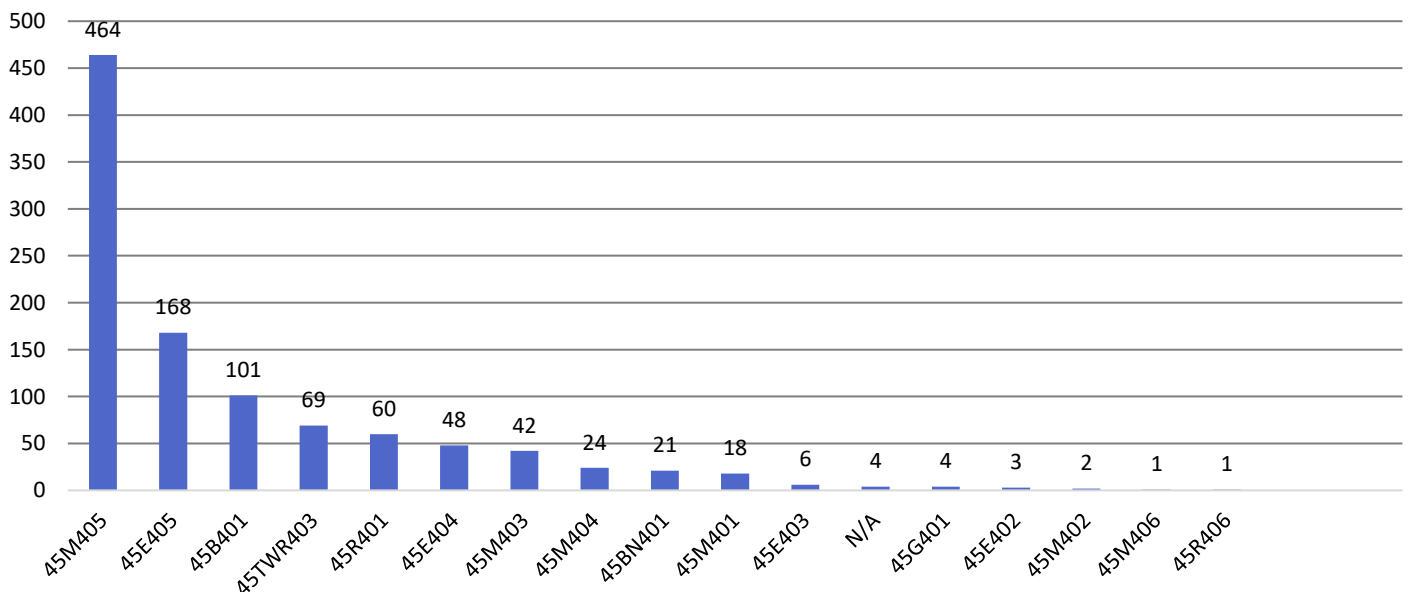

Station 405 Area - Runs By Apparatus

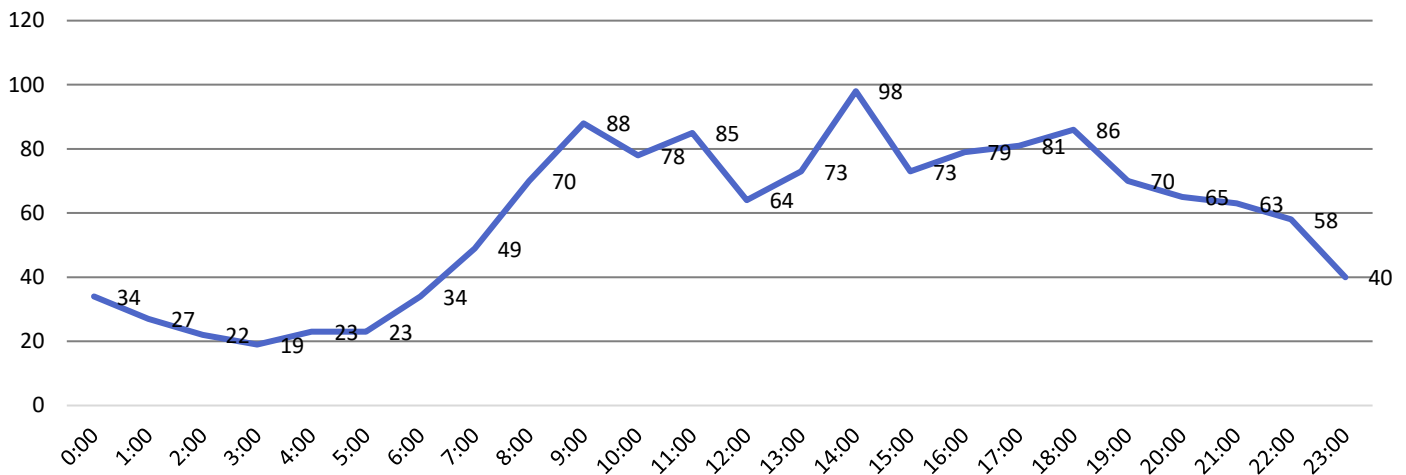


WELCOME TO STATION 406

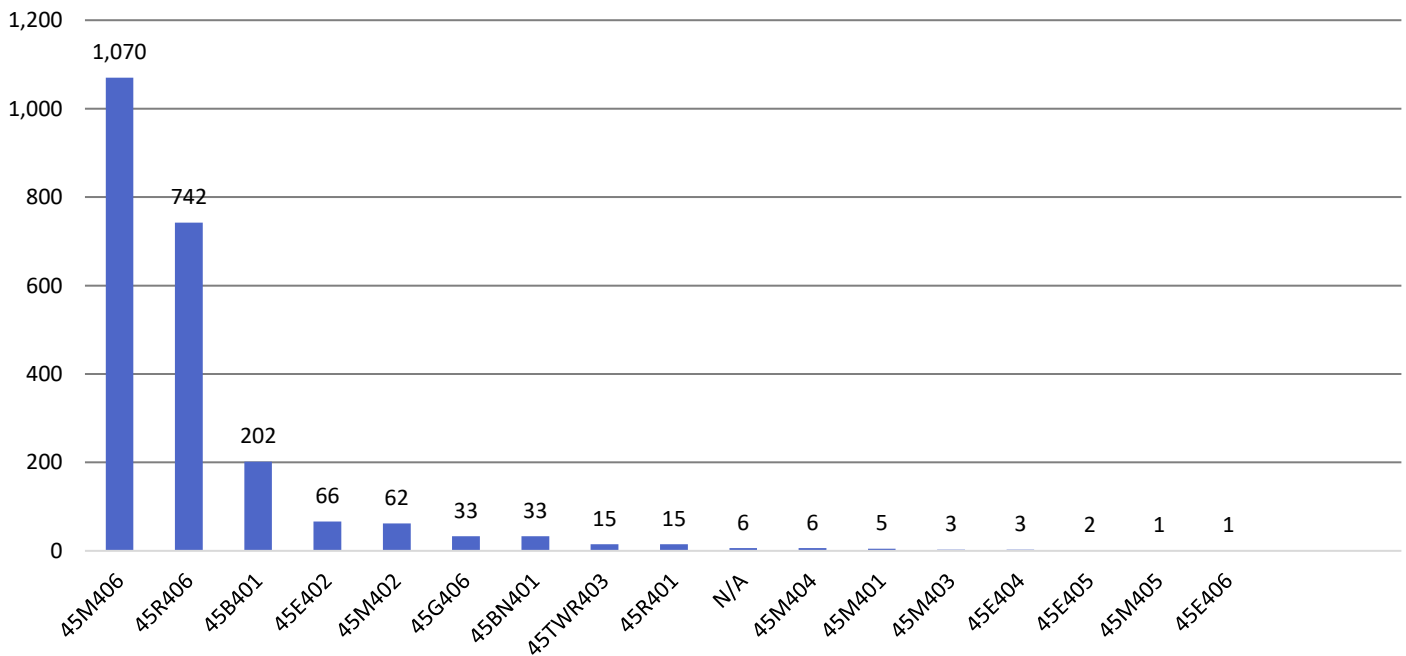

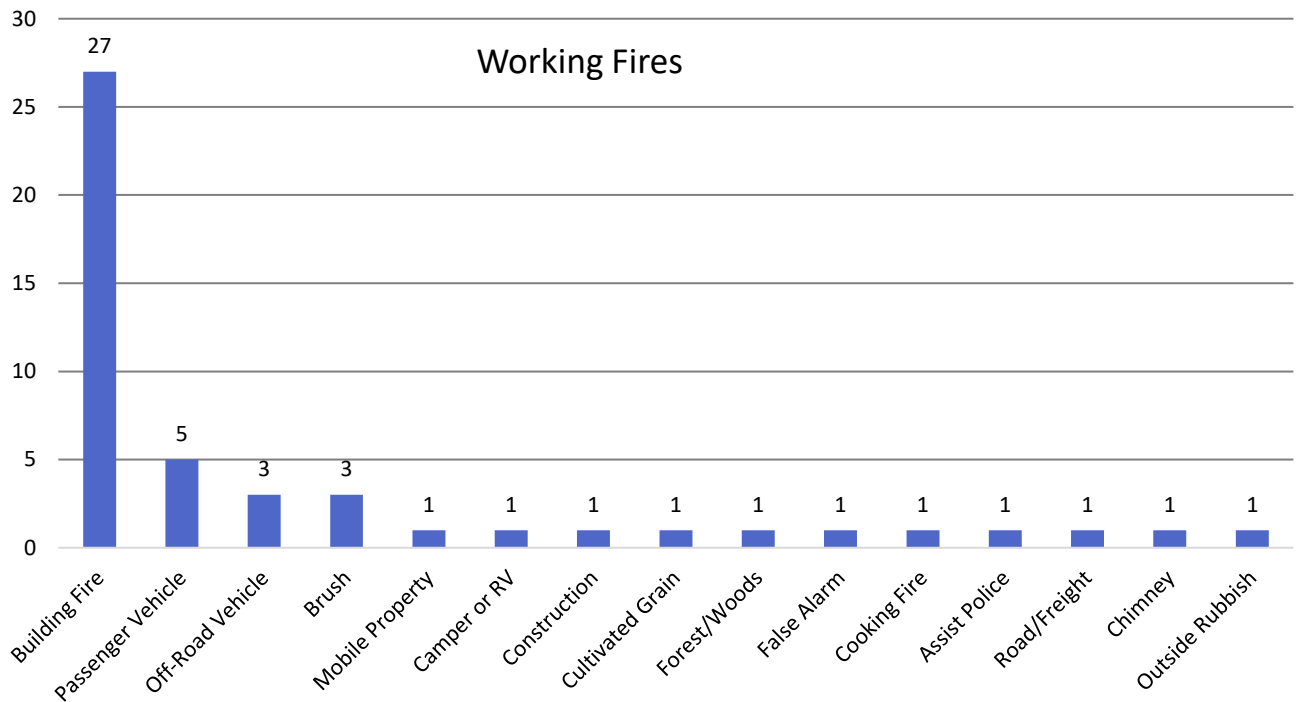
Call Volume by Time of Day



Station 406 Area - Runs By Apparatus

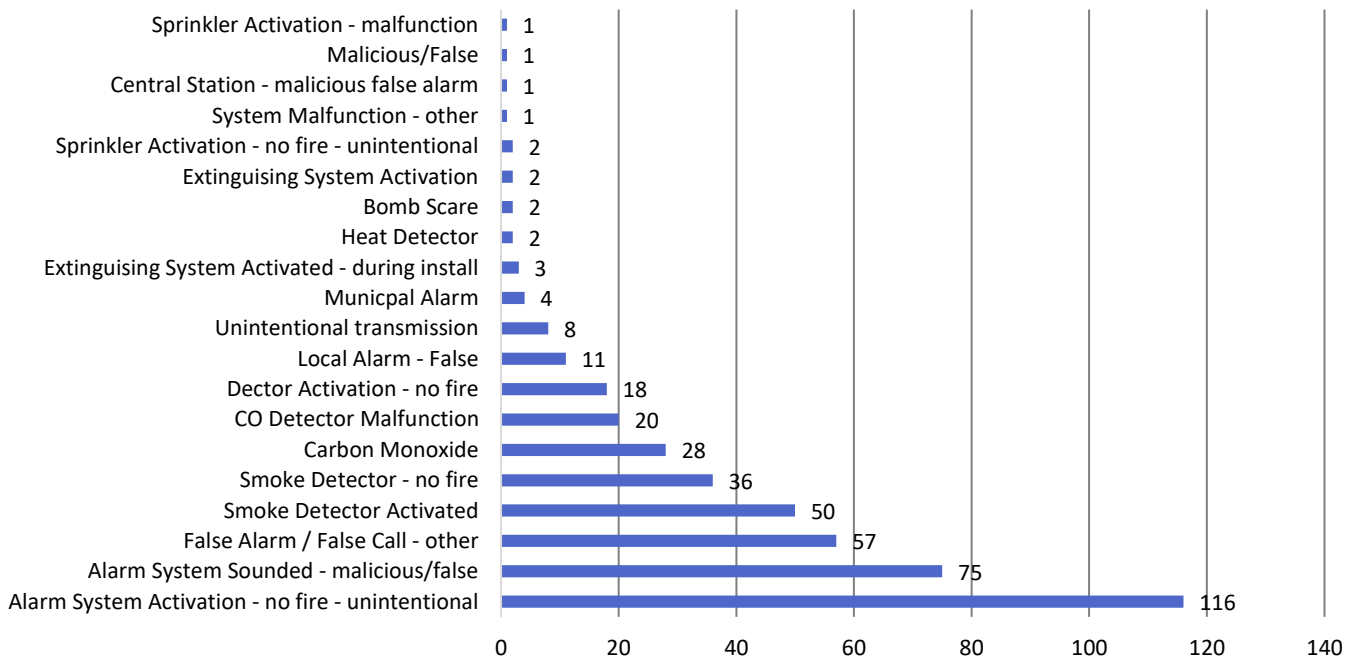

False Alarm Data

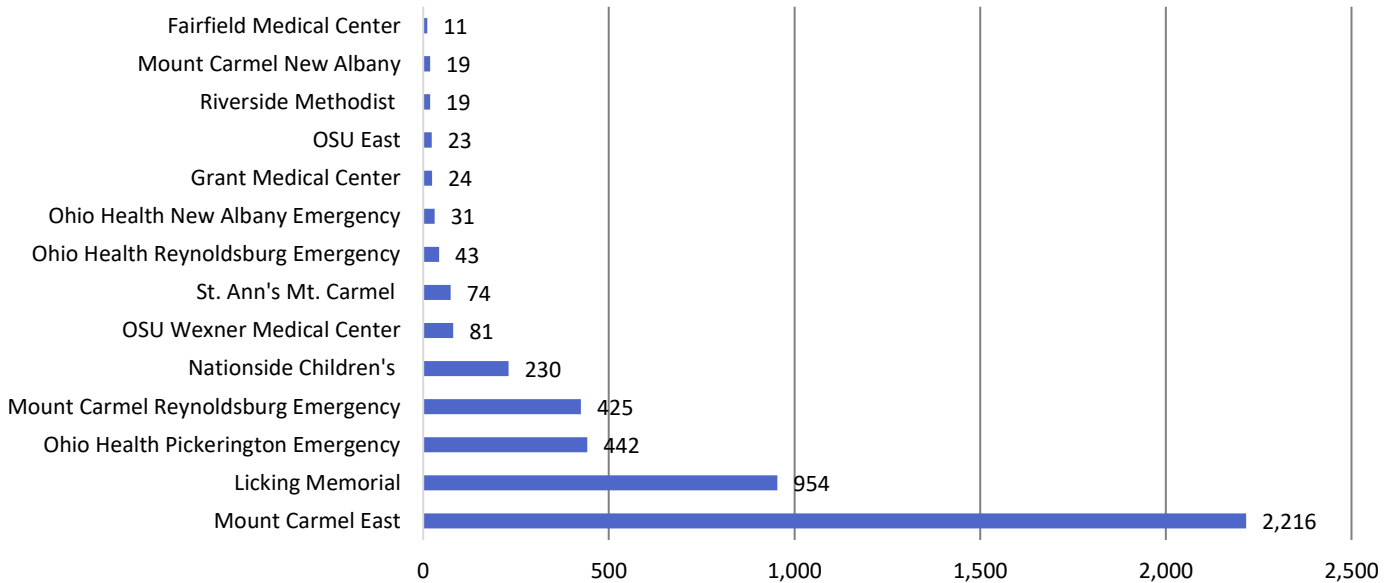
False Alarms by Incident Type

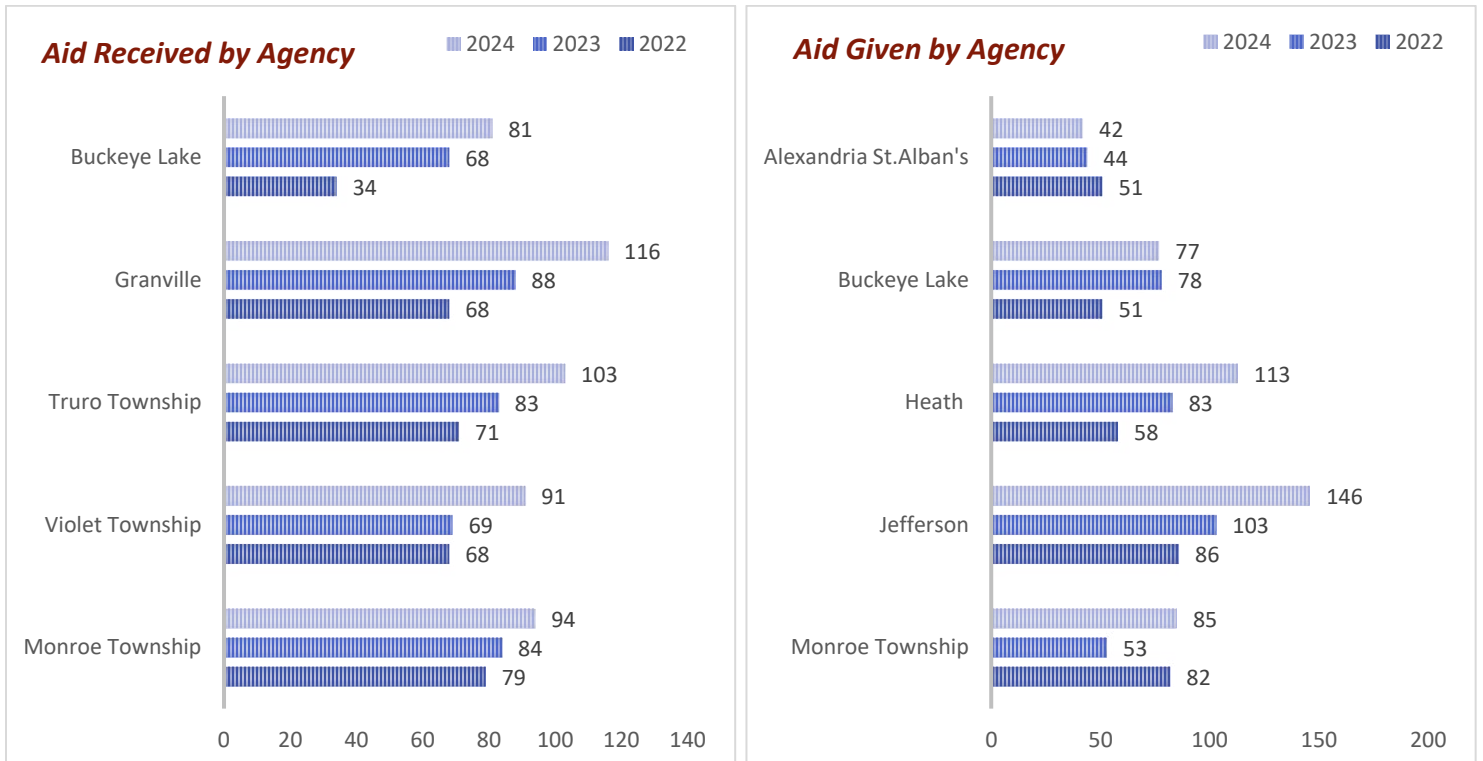

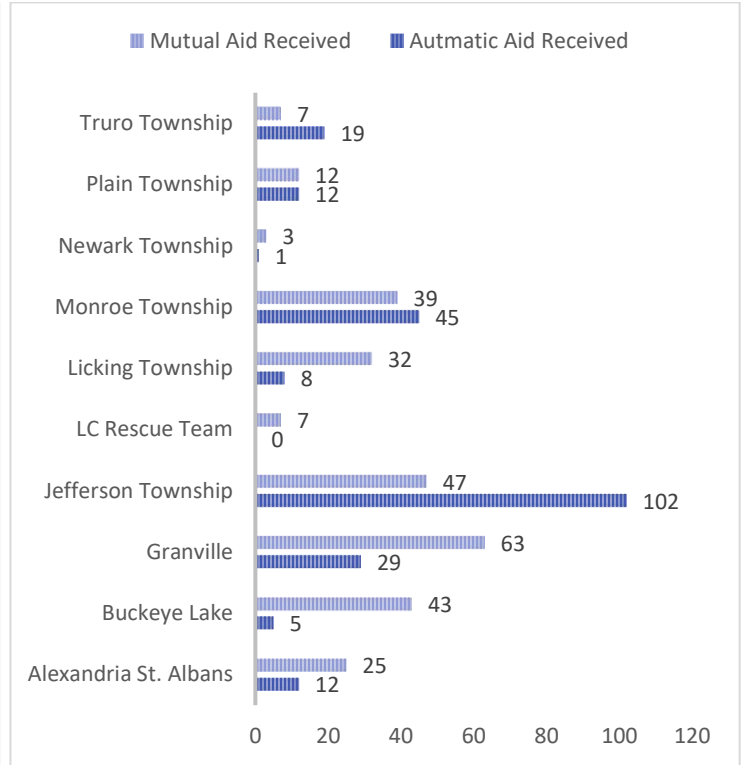

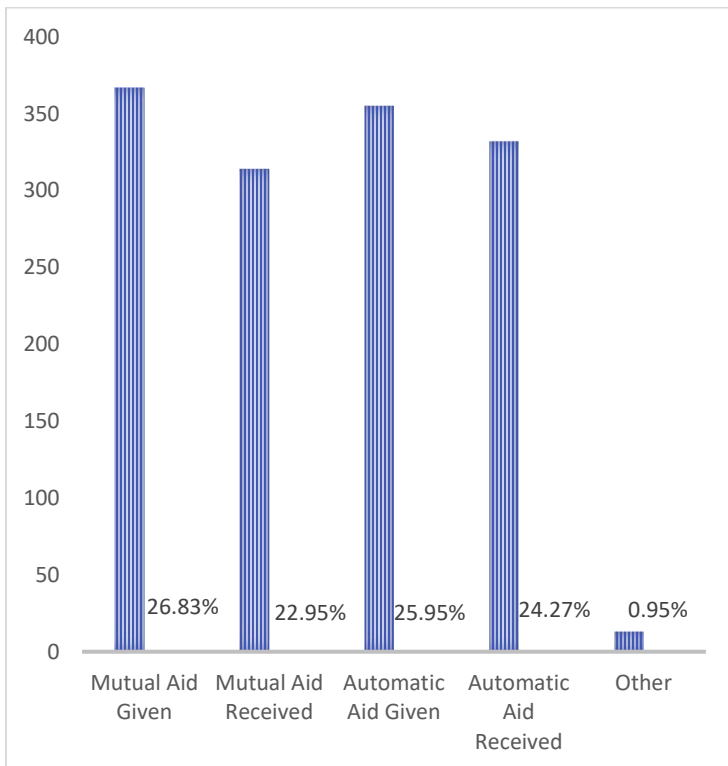

Breakdown of the mutual aid data for all of 2024

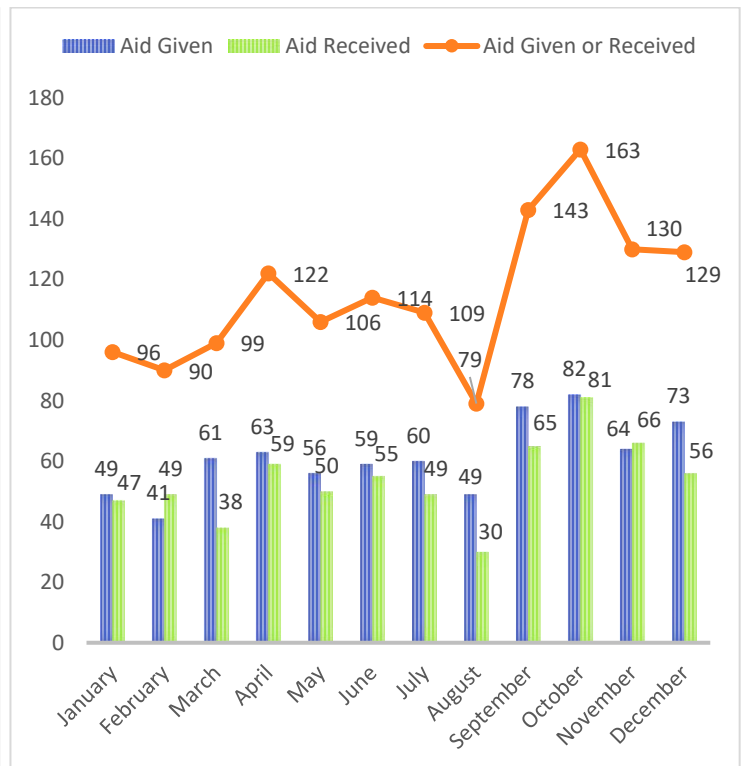


Total Mutal Aid Given/Received: 681

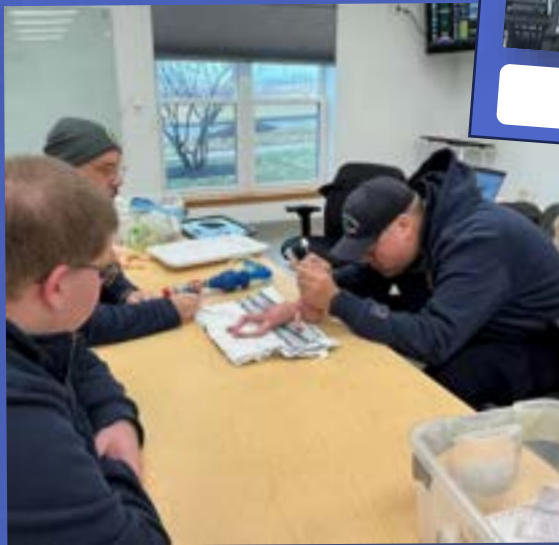
